
By partnering with other business lenders, educational institutions, not-for-profits, and municipal governments, we help grow and diversify the economy in our service area.

It has been an honour to serve as the Chair of Community Futures Prince Albert and District (PACF) over the past year, contributing to the economic growth in our district. PACF, a part of the Community Futures National Network, has been serving North Central Saskatchewan since 1997. We are tasked by Prairies Economic Development Canada (PrairiesCan) to provide tailored advice, support, training, and small business loans to the business community to promote economic development in our area.

The past year brought about changes for PACF, including our relocation to the new downtown location in the New Chamber HQ building and a new General Manager, Kayla Bear. We are excited about the positive contributions and new ideas that Kayla and our organization can offer to Prince Albert, downtown, and the surrounding area.

In the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the PACF Credit Committee approved 14 loans totaling \$730,692. Our organization continues to maintain one of the lowest loan delinquency rates in the province. In addition to our financial support, we also provided 13 PACF clients with a Side Hustle MicroGrant of \$500 each. The Side Hustle program is designed to assist individuals with entrepreneurial aspirations and guide them on how to bring their ideas to life. We are eager to witness the success of these entrepreneurs in their local communities and plan to sustain the Side Hustle Program well into the future.

Looking ahead, we will continue to focus on forging new partnerships, offering training opportunities, and organizing business events in the community. By emphasizing character lending and community connection, we aim to build upon our past accomplishments and fulfill our aspirations for our future.

#### **LOANS**

Community Futures is an alternate source of business funding offering loans to businesses for start-up or expansion. Funding is available up to \$150,000 to be used for capital expenditures or operating requirements.

Flexible, affordable Community Futures loans are specifically designed for new start-ups, expansions, or to buy a business in a rural community. Solutions are tailored to meet the needs of the individual business and decisions are made locally.





#### **ADVICE**

Prince Albert and District Community Futures has been supporting businesses in our region for over 25 years. Our mandate is to provide a variety of support services to anyone wanting to start, expand, franchise or sell a business in the community. Our services include:

Small business coaching

One-on-one start-up or expansion consulting

Support in gaining access to other small business supports, information, & access to capital

Succession planning

The Entrepreneurs with Disabilities Program (EDP) helps people with disabilities or health conditions start or expand businesses.

This program is open to anyone with a viable business idea who has a self declared disability or a health condition.

We're funded in part by the Government of Canada's Opportunities Fund for Persons with Disabilities Program, Elevate provides assistance, support and resources to qualified individuals who wish to become self-employed.

Up to \$750 in funding is available for rural entrepreneurs with health conditions or disabilities to access professional services to move their business sales online, enhance their online services or improve online marketing.
